

Mayor Bucciferro called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

PRVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Mayor Bucciferro opened the privilege of the floor at 7:03p.m.

Bonnie Belfance of 121 Jay Street read the following to be entered into the minutes:

One June 14th Lee Pooler and I presented a proposal for the building of a museum honoring the Scotia Fire Department and its founding members. We asked the Scotia Board of Trustees for permission to build it on land near the Flint House.

I understand that the board was busy with the planning of the fireworks on June 30th. But two months have passed since our presentation, and we have heard nothing from the board. The infamous rumor mill has presented itself with the fact that the board feels it is too big and that they are under the impression that it is going to be a garage. No one has approached either of us for further information.

We understand that the Flint House had only 2 visitors in 2022 and that is sad. If you look across the river in Rotterdam with the Mabee House. During the school year you will find school districts from the surrounding areas there for field trips. They have events all year long bringing people to the area. The Flint Hose and the Fire Department Museum could be a point of interest for our own community and the surrounding school districts.

I have presented the same presentation to the Business Improvement District July 11th and spoke to them about what this museum and the Flint House could do to help our commerce here in the Village.

This little village was an important part of the settling of Western New York State and the Western Part of the Country. The Mohawk River was a main throughfare long before the building of the Eire Canal.

I have started a plan with the names of residents that could form the board of directors and an association of active, retired firefighters and citizens as members. This includes a mission statement and a charter to be sent into the NYS department of education. This plan would eventually include the Flint House and the development of a point of interest. I have reached out to the Firefighters Museum in Hudson, NY and Long Island Firefighters Museum in town of Islip. Both organizations have offered their help in establishing a new museum. I have approached our elected officials both locally, state and federal about obtaining funds in keeping this museum going in the future.

The fire department held its 150th anniversary celebration in Collins Park four weeks ago and it was a success. Several parents and grandparents asked me if this could be an annual event for the children. I have asked some of the basic planners Why Not?

When we came here in June asking permission to build the museum – our concern was the storage of our 1830 Hand Pumper, Hose Carriages and the collection of 150 years artifacts and history of this Fire Department. We want to honor all those firefighters that came before us with the building commemorating their efforts to build this fire department and the village. We were at that time in a position where we could pay for the erection of the building with some left over for the interior.

August 9, 2023

We were hoping to have this building erected and closed for the winter by September and moving everything into it by October. This would only involve a move from the present fire station to the museum building.

Now, because of this delay we are now going to have to take some of the money and plan for the storage of the artifacts, glass cases, pictures, trophies and all the equipment we have purchased over the years.

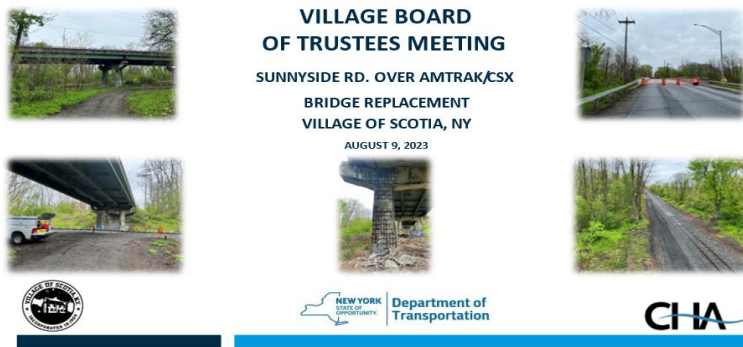
We had hoped that this proposal would be of some importance to the board in saving our history not only of the fire department but that of the village.

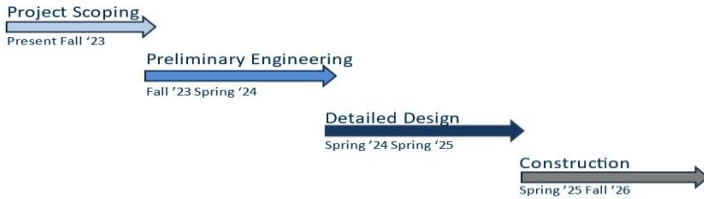
