**RESOLUTION IN CONNECTION WITH THE VILLAGE OF SCOTIA DETERMINATION
OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE PURSUANT TO THE STATE ENVIRONMENTAL
QUALITY REVIEW ACT (SEQRA) REGULATIONS 6NYCRR PART 617**

WHEREAS, the Village of Scotia has determined that it needs to continue to treat Collins Lake with an herbicide in order to target treat the invasive Water Chestnut; and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Scotia has reviewed treatment options with Ready Scout, LLC and has determined the use of the herbicide, Sculpin G will selectively control the target invasive plant allowing desirable native species to remain for fish habitat, bottom cover and oxygen production; and,

WHEREAS, as part of the environmental review of the project, the Village of Scotia Village Board has accepted Lead Agency status and has conducted a coordinated review of this unlisted action in compliance with regulations required under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA); and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Scotia Village Board as lead agency has completed a final detailed review of the Part 2 of the SEAF, and has made a determination that this unlisted action will not have a significant environmental impact;
